PASTOR'S CORNER: As Jesus was dying on the cross, some of his last words were to his mother, Mary and the apostle John. "Woman, behold your son," he said to Mary; "Behold your mother," he said to John. At one level, Jesus was providing for his widowed and soon to be childless mother. But at a deeper level, he was providing for us and the entire Church. He was calling his mother to accept all of his disciples as her children, and his disciples to accept Mary as their mother. There could be no clearer statement in the Scriptures of the great dignity and honor Christians must have toward the Mother of God. It is no coincidence that the month of May is both dedicated to our Blessed Mother and also the time of Mother's Day. Just as our own earthly mothers gave birth to us, so our spiritual mother, Mary, made possible our

spiritual rebirth when she told the angel 'Let it be done unto me according to your word.' And like any good mother who always prays and cares for her children, our mother Mary intercedes for us and is a channel for God's own love for us. Someone who would dishonor his own mother is no man at all. And someone who does not honor our Blessed Mother Mary can hardly call himself a child of God. So this May, be sure to honor all the mothers in your life. But don't forget the Woman whom Jesus gave as a mother to us all.
