PASTOR'S CORNER: – We are now well into the Season of Easter. It doesn't quite grab our attention the way Lent does, with its ashes, penances, fasting, abstaining from meat, and fish fries. This is typical of the Church's liturgy. We spend some time preparing for a feast of some importance, and then we spend some more time after it, basking as it were, in the graces of that feast. We prepare for Christmas with the season of Advent; then we have a Christmas season, when we hope to carry forward some of that Christmas spirit. It's similar with the Easter season. Lent is supposed to be hard. We are supposed to 'feel' its penances. That helps us celebrate Easter all the more. But how do we carry forward the 'Easter' spirit? Well, you might notice that most of the Sunday Gospels and the readings from the Acts of the Apostles tell of the earliest

Christians 'witnessing' the Risen Lord. This is meant quite literally. They saw Jesus, touched Him, heard Him, ate with Him. They were witnesses to His resurrection. Christians are still called to be witnesses to the resurrected Jesus. We have not witnessed Him by sight, like the apostles. We 'witness' Him with the eyes of faith. As Jesus said to St. Thomas: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Jesus is extending His blessing to us, who haven't seen as the apostles did, but who believe still! And like the apostles, fully witnessing to Jesus means more than just 'seeing' Him. It means acting in a way that reflects our belief that Jesus is risen from the dead, and that our eyes are fixed on eternal life rather than this world. When we act kindly, gently, mercifully, lovingly toward one another, we are witnessing by our own lives the Truth in we believe. **David Wheeler Ordination** – the son of Michael and Becky Wheeler, will be ordained as a priest for the Diocese of Lexington on June 29th. A few people have already expressed interest in going to the Ordination at the Cathedral in Lexington.
