PASTOR'S CORNER: I just wanted to give an update on the work on the exterior of the church, which has been proceeding slowly but surely over the last few weeks. The two sets of wooden doors in the bell tower have been removed to the school, where they were dried out, years of paint scraped off, rotted areas rebuilt with liquid wood, and refinished. The door jambs have been refurbished and repainted. When the doors are put back in their places, we will move on to the doors that everyone uses normally to enter church. The eight round windows in the bell tower have been re-secured to the walls and painted. Some of the stonework on the façade has been repainted. The workers are now pressure washing the façade. After this is completed, they will be able to cover the church in a water-proof coating. As I've mentioned before, these are not things that will make a dramatic difference in the appearance of our church, but it is the kind of maintenance work that will keep our church looking beautiful for years to come. I want to thank all of you for your generosity

to our Legacy Fund, which is making this work possible. I hope you will continue that generosity as we complete this first phase of our work to preserve St. Rose.
