MARRIAGE MOMENTS: Aug 4: "Vanity of vanities...All things are vanity"(Eccl 1: 2) Let's face it, all of us are vain to some extent. We want to look good to others. Perhaps one of the few people who will give us honest feedback about our faults is your spouse. Share one weakness that you observe in him/her today, but balance it with one thing that makes you proud of them. Humbly accept both.

PARENTING POINTERS: Aug 4: "Stop lying to one another." (Col 3:9) Usually people don't lie because they are bad, evil people but rather because they are afraid or want to protect themselves. Talk with your family about whether there is a time when a lie is acceptable?

PASTOR'S CORNER: 1) St. Dominic - On August 8th, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Dominic. This day is of particular significance for us friars, as it was St. Dominic who founded the Order of Preachers, or Dominicans, as we are more commonly known, some 800 years ago. The tapestry hanging on the left side of the church is of St. Dominic, and there is a fine statue of him in the yard south of the church. It is customary for Dominicans to refer to him as 'Our holy father Dominic.' As the name of the Order he founded suggests, Dominic was keen to form a body of priests and brothers who would be able to preach the Faith, based on sound doctrine, the assiduous study of sacred truth, and prayer. Today, the Order continues to try to live out that vocation. It was said of St. Dominic that he was always speaking either with God or about God. I don't think that means he never spoke outside of prayer or preaching, but rather that

he constantly sought to speak words that revealed the great love of Christ, words of hope, words that sought to build people up in the good things of God. One does not have to be a preacher or a priest to 'speak about God' in this way. It is simply putting our words and actions in the service of the Gospel. There is a wonderful antiphon we Dominicans sing which well expresses the honor in which we hold this great saint: "O light of the Church, teacher of truth, rose of patience, ivory of chastity, freely you poured forth the waters of wisdom. Preacher of grace, unite us with the blessed."
