**PASTOR'S CORNER: Christian Marriage, Part 2** - We saw in the first part that all marriage, Christian or not, consists of a covenant between one man and one woman, who pledge fidelity to each other for the rest of their earthly lives, and who hope their relationship to be fruitful with children. What makes marriage 'Christian' is that this covenant is elevated to the status of a Sacrament. In any sacrament, Christ becomes truly present to the person who receives that sacrament - as healer in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, as forgiver of sins in Penance, in his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. A Christian marriage takes place when two baptized people exchange marriage vows. When that happens, Christ becomes uniquely present to them, forming, by grace, a special bond between the two spouses. So, as the spouses go forward, striving to be faithful to each other in good times and bad, in sickness and health, they draw the strength to do that, not

just from their own good intentions and will, but from the strength of Jesus Christ and his grace. The Church has always seen great significance in the fact that Jesus' first miracle was performed at a wedding (the Wedding Feast of Cana). St. Paul eloquently wrote about the Sacrament of Marriage being a sign of the relationship of Christ and the Church – Jesus and his Church in a bond of lasting and loving fidelity, just as two spouses are united in a life-long love.
