PASTOR'S CORNER: Christian Marriage, Part 3 - We have already seen how marriage was part of God's original plan for creation, and how Christ elevated marriage to the status of a sacrament. There is something unique about the Sacrament of Marriage among all the other sacraments. Every sacrament has a minister, and for all the other sacraments, the minister is generally a bishop, priest, or deacon, or at least a person other than the one receiving the sacrament. In Christian Marriage, the ministers of the sacrament are the spouses themselves. Husband and wife administer the sacrament to each other by the recitation of their vows. The Church ordinarily requires a priest or deacon and two witnesses to also be present at a wedding, but they are not the ministers of the sacrament. The couple themselves are the ministers. As such, the

sacrament of marriage is a special exercise of that 'priesthood of all believers' the Church speaks of. A priest is one who offers sacrifice to God. In marriage, the spouses sacrifice themselves completely for the sake of the other – for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness, and in health. Jesus tells us there is no greater love than this, then to lay down your life for your friend. The spouses make of themselves an offering to God, as they offer themselves totally for this friend of theirs, who is their husband or wife. The quality of that marriage will be in direct proportion to the degree that *both* partners enter into that self-sacrificing love which is a sign of the self-sacrificing love of Christ for His Church.
