PASTOR'S CORNER: You may notice two new headstones in the Friars' Cemetery as you walk to the front of church. These are for four of our Dominican brethren whom we know are buried at St. Rose, but whose monuments have long since disappeared. Our Province purchased the headstones to commemorate their presence on the grounds of the first Dominican community in the United States. I would like to introduce you to our new/old neighbors (we know little about them in any event). Peter Pitt was a cooperator brother of the Order, a native of England and a convert to the Faith, known as a zealous, pious man. Robert Young was a clerical brother, meaning he died while he was still studying for the priesthood. A native of Maryland, he was part of the first 'class' of brothers to make vows, and was a nephew of Fr. Edward Dominic Fenwick, founder of St. Rose. His was the first death in the Dominican community. Thomas L. Keenan was another

clerical brother and a native of Ireland. John V. Morrin, a clerical brother, also born in Ireland, made his profession of vows on his death bed. Praying for the dead is a serious obligation for every Christian. We Dominicans make an effort to be especially devoted to the Holy Souls. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE: 40 Days for Life is a nation-wide effort to get Christians of all denominations to fast and pray for an end to legalized abortion in this country and a greater respect for human life. This includes an effort to have Christians pray around the clock for 40 days outside of abortion clinics. Fortunately, Springfield does not have such a place. But to make a public show of support for this effort, we will be gathering each Saturday morning at 9:30 am at the old Court House, from Saturday, September 28th (except for Saturday, October 5th – we will pray the rosary at the Rachel Mourning Statue here at St. Rose) up to and including November 2nd. We will be praying the Rosary together for the sake of the unborn. All are welcome to join in this prayer.
