PASTOR'S CORNER: The Secret Prayers, Part 1 - During the Mass, there are several prayers which the priest is supposed to say in a soft voice, inaudible to the congregation. These are the so-called 'Secret' Prayers - from the Latin word for 'hidden.' (You won't find them in the missalette!) They are not said out loud because they are more in the way of a personal preparation of the priest for what he is about to do, than a public prayer. I thought I would 'reveal' these 'hidden' prayers, since they might help all of you in your celebration of the Mass. The first two have to do with the first 'high point' of Mass, the proclamation of the Gospel. Since the Gospel contains the actual deeds and words of Jesus himself, it is treated with greater honor than the other parts of Scripture, e.g. we stand during its reading. The priest or deacon who proclaims

the Gospel is also expected to be prepared for such a holy duty. A priest, before proclaiming the Gospel, bows before the altar and says: "Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel." For a deacon, the priest blesses the deacon, putting the same prayer in a form of a blessing. Whoever proclaims the Gospel, speaks the words of our Lord to us, just as they were proclaimed by Jesus himself 2000 years ago. They speak to us today, just as they did then. We should not want to speak (or hear) those words with unclean lips or hearts. When the priest or deacon has finished reading the Gospel, he kisses the book and prays: "Through the words of the Gospel, may our sins be wiped away." It is not enough for the words of the Gospel to be read. We want them to have an effect in those who hear them – for the weak to be encouraged, the suffering to be consoled, for sinners to repent. We can all make these prayers our own and perhaps make our own hearing of the Gospel more fruitful.
