PASTOR'S CORNER: The Secret Prayers, Part 3 - In this brief series, we are looking at the so-called 'secret' prayers of the Mass - prayers said silently by the priest. *The next one is said during the Preparation of the Gifts. After thanking God for the gifts of bread and wine He has given us to offer ("Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation..."), the priest bows behind the altar and prays: "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God." The bread and wine we offer represent our participation in the Sacrifice of Christ, they represent our whole selves. But even these 'works of human hands' are gifts from God. That is why we ask the Lord to accept them not with great pride and bluster, but 'with humble spirit and contrite heart.' The 'sacrifice' we make of*

our lives is simply giving back to God what already belongs to God. But that sacrifice is pleasing to the Lord because our humble offerings (our own selves) are joined to the one great sacrifice of Jesus Christ. So when you see the priest bowing behind the altar at this time, recall that at this Mass, you will be lifting your whole self up to God in sacrifice, so that you, in return might be filled with the grace of Christ. The more we offer ourselves to God the Father through Jesus, the more He will be able to transform our lives to be more like that of His beloved Son. As we hear in Psalm 116: "What return shall I make to the Lord for all his goodness to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord."
