PASTOR'S CORNER: The American bishops issued guidance to American Catholics concerning the various COVID-19 vaccines available to them. I fear this may have created some confusion for some of you. Maybe this will help clarify matters. You may recall a few weeks back I discussed here the moral qualms some had regarding the first vaccines available, from Pfizer and Moderna. Both of these were tested using fetal stem cell lines which ultimately originated in a miscarriage or abortion from 1973. Since then, these cell lines have been cloned many hundreds of times. The bishops and Pope Francis himself made the judgment that whatever, if any, cooperation in evil this may represent, by enjoying the fruits of an evil action, is very much outweighed by the good of obtaining a vaccine and contributing to the common good. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine, however, used these same stem cell lines, not only in testing, but in development of the vaccine as well. To be clear, there are no cells from aborted children in any of the vaccines. It is simply that those cells were used by Johnson & Johnson to produce certain proteins that generated the vaccine. Because the Johnson & Johnson vaccine used these stem cell lines more than the other vaccines, the bishops advised that if the other vaccines are available to you, you should avoid the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. While the bishops' analysis is correct, I don't want anyone to take away the idea that the bishops are discouraging us from getting the COVID-19 vaccine. They are not. In fact, they made clear that if only the Johnson & Johnson vaccine is available to you, then you should get that vaccine. In other words, it is not immoral to receive any of the vaccines currently available to us. The bishops want to make clear to us that we are in a fallen world. Many things we do are 'compromised' in

some way; there are many ways we benefit from evils that are much closer to us than the stem cell lines used for these vaccines. Did you buy Heinz ketchup, Energizer batteries, Doritos, or Lay's potato chips? These are all companies which donate to Planned Parenthood. Do you use any lithium batteries? These are often mined using child and forced labor. Buy anything from China? More forced labor. Do you help manufacture spirituous liquors? Are you not contributing to drunk driving in some small way? I am not saying you should not buy ketchup or lithium batteries or things from China or work for a distillery. You are not doing anything wrong in doing these things. Nor is there anything wrong in receiving the vaccines now available to us. But in a fallen world, evil is all around us. It requires discernment and prudence to keep from compromising ourselves too much or becoming too complacent. Having said that, getting the vaccine is a good thing and I don't want anyone who would like to receive the vaccine to have doubts because of what the bishops have said. More than half a million have died in our country alone. The vaccines are our only way back to normalcy.
