2023 BLACK AND INDIAN MISSION COLLECTION: Next weekend, February 25th & 26th, we will take up the annual Black and Indian Mission Collection. This Collection

exists to help diocesan communities preach the Gospel of Jesus among the African American, Native American, and Alaskan Native people of God. Your donations help fund parish-based catechetical programs, support teacher and catechist professional development, encourage vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and create diocesan structures, such as our own archdiocesan Office of Multicultural Ministry, that support ministry and evangelization in these diverse ethnic communities.

PASTOR'S CORNER: Lent is described as a penitential season, a time of penance. That great Dominican theologian St. Thomas Aguinas defined penance as a disposition of the will aimed at giving God what is His rightful due, by grieving for those acts that have offended God, and by seeking to make amends for them, through some kind of compensation. Just as a prisoner seeks to 'pay his debt to society' by accepting his punishment, so a Christian, with sorrow in his heart for his sins, strives to pay his debt to God through acts of the virtue of penance. Those acts of penance are traditionally prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Thus, the penances we take upon ourselves for Lent are not 'something special we do for God,' but simply our poor efforts to make good on our sins of commission and omission. The Church sees that everyone must practice some kind of penance during Lent – fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; abstinence from meat on all Fridays of Lent - but keep in mind that this is the minimum. The rule is there simply to make sure that everyone is doing something. But we are all invited to more! But penance is not simply a punishment or penalty. These acts of penance - of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving - are the very things the soul needs to grow in charity: prayer draws us closer to God; fasting makes us humble and tempers the passions; almsgiving opens our hearts and hands in generosity and love toward our neighbor. So let this Lent be a time of joyful penance, when the bitter tears of sadness for sin are replaced by the refreshing waters of salvation.

ASH WEDNESDAY: Wednesday, February 22 is Ash Wednesday. Mass and the distribution of ashes will be at 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Mass at Holy Rosary will be at 5:00 p.m.
